# **Work-Based Learning**

- Work-Based Learning courses are collected for school report cards and Perkins.
- Work-Based Learning can also be used in Career Pathway creation for Carl Perkins to meet size, scope and quality.
- Work-Based Learning is submitted to DPI through WISE when a student is taking a course identified as Certified or Non-certified and meets the 6 criteria. (Be aware of WBL changes prior to 21.22 SY).
- Work-Based Learning data element
- Work-Based Learning 21.22 is due in WISEdash for District before December 6, 2022. If Certified/Non-certified is not showing correctly in WISEdash on December 6, 2022 - you will miss the count.
- Calculated for Perkins Accountability Reports and school report cards. 11-12th grade Concentrator students

#### Certified already meets 6 criteria for WBL

- Certified Career Based Learning means that an outside organization creates the requirements that schools follow.
- Certificated Program Status Type is the final step to send this data.

#### 6 criteria of WBL (Non-Certified)

- 1. Involves sustained interactions, either paid or unpaid, with industry or community professionals.
- a. Sustained = minimum of 90 hours, can be rotated among employers and/or positions, the employer is engaged throughout the experience. Can take place in one semester, an entire year, the summer, or even a six-week period.
- b. Interactions must be more than just observing and include direct communication and involvement with industry or community professionals
- 2. Takes place in real workplace settings (as practicable) or simulated environments at an educational institution.
- 3. Fosters in-depth, firsthand engagement with the tasks required in a given career.
- 4. Aligns with a course (generally speaking should be a minimum of one semester). It is highly encouraged to provide credit for the work-based learning experience as well as credit for the school-based course.
- 5. Must include a training agreement between the student, employer/business, and school that defines the roles and responsibilities of the student, the employer, and the school.
- 6. Business and education partners work together to evaluate and supervise the experiences, which must be documented with training or learning plans and evaluation forms.

#### Reporting Non-Certified, Work-Based Learning courses:

- Ensure that the course is using one of the 6 names listed above
- Ensure that the course meets all 6 criteria for Work-Based Learning
  - If the course does not meet the 6 criteria for WBL it is a Career Based Learning Experience and should be called something else. Do not report as Non-Certified or WBL.
  - CTE Team can work toward updating the course to become Non-Certified, WBL, in the future.
- #4 of WBL Aligns with a course (generally speaking should be a minimum of one semester). It is highly encouraged to provide credit for the work-based learning experience as well as credit for the school-based course.

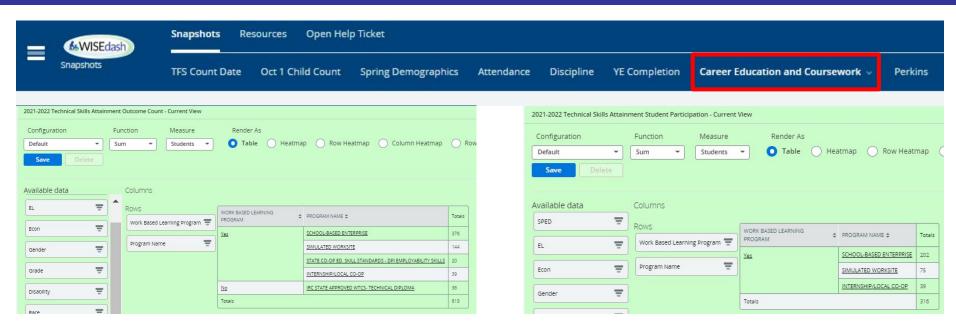
#### Reporting Certified, Work-Based Learning courses

- Certified Career Education already meets the 6 criteria of WBL.
- An outside organization (DWD, DPI) creates the requirements that schools follow.
- #4 of WBL Aligns with a course (generally speaking should be a minimum of one semester). It is highly encouraged to provide credit for the work-based learning experience as well as credit for the school-based course.
- At the end of course grading enter <u>Certificate Program Status Type</u> for each student, indicating their progress.
  - A Completed with Certificate-Student met the requirements of the certificated program and was or is to be awarded a certificate
  - B Continuing-Student is continuing in the certificated program
  - C Exited-Student has left the certificated program before completion
  - D Completed without Cerificate-Student completed program but did not meet the requirements for the certificate
- Check with CTE teacher at end of course to obtain student information.
- Certificate Program Status Type must be sent thru WISE for Certified programs to report.

# **Work-Based Learning**

- Each student information system vendor has directions for identifying Certified/Non-Certified courses.
- Use your CTE Data team to:
  - Identify who creates courses in your SIS Data Entry personnel
  - Identify who checks WISEdata Portal for Certified/Non-Certified Export
  - Identify who checks WISEdash for District>Snapshot>Technical Skills Attainment>Work-Based Learning crosstab
- WBL data must be reporting in WISEdash for District before December Snapshot
- Data changed in the SIS after the Snapshot will not be used for school report card or Perkins calculation for that reporting year.

### **WISEdata Portal**

- Review Certified/Non-Certified Export
- You will see that each student has multiple courses listed, if you setup your coursemaster per semester/term/quarter.
- Pay attention to how many lines are showing for each students semester/term/quarter
- Read columns to I-P
- Certificated Program Status will report as a Non Course, once it is entered.
- You only need to enter Certificated Program Status Type, once for the length of time a student took a Certified course. Pay attention to the multiple types of Certified programs. In case, additional Certificated Program Status Types need to be entered.
- This export can be used to assist in identifying students, but there could be additional.
- Create a system to know all the Certified Career Education Program opportunities.
