### School Reopening and Students Experiencing Homelessness

As many districts are moving into hybrid models or bringing students back to school full time in cohorts, we've had many questions about what to do if there is not space (due to social distancing requirements) in a school of origin classroom. Students experiencing homelessness cannot be denied in-person instruction because of space. If there is not space in a student's school of origin, they must be given priority on a waitlist. We also encourage districts to prioritize any students experiencing homelessness for in-person learning. Many districts are choosing to place students in other classrooms where there may be space or offering the option to attend in another building where there is space (along with transportation). Districts should look at all options to remove barriers to student attendance. We encourage homeless liaisons to continue advocating for students experiencing homelessness during reopening to ensure a plan is place to support these students.

## Announcing the NEW 2021-23 EHCY Compliance Grant!

DPI is happy to announce the new 2021-23 EHCY Compliance Grant! The grant application will be available spring 2021 and is available to all Wisconsin LEAs, including public school districts and independent charter schools.

#### The purpose of the grant is to:

- Strive for equitable distribution of EHCY funds throughout the state.
- Provide increased technical support to districts to ensure compliance with the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act.
- Encourage recipients to go beyond compliance in a select area.
- Provide the opportunity for districts to feel prepared to apply for the EHCY 3-year innovation grant.

#### **Grant Overview**

Funding: Year 1: \$10,000, Year 2: \$5,000

Requirements during the 2-year grant:

- Focus on either Identification and Enrollment OR Staff and Community Awareness.
- Complete the compliance review process.
- Participate in quarterly technical assistance calls and other meetings or trainings as requested by the DPI EHCY team.

#### Spending TI Homeless Reservation Funds

Many districts have not yet budgeted or spent the homeless reservation in their Title I, Part A budgets. We encourage homeless liaisons to connect with ESEA coordinators to advocate for how the funds can be used during the remainder of this academic year to support students experiencing homelessness.
