Updated Performance Levels for Statewide Assessments

Updated student performance level descriptors have been developed to describe student performance on statewide standardized assessments. The terms developing, approaching, meeting, and advanced are replace the previous, outdated terms. These updated performance levels will be used to report the Forward Exam, ACT, and PreACT Secure assessment data and results beginning with the 2023-24 administration. The DPI received overwhelming support for this change from Wisconsin educators, administrators, parents, families, and education partners in a survey. Sharing Results from the Wisconsin Student Assessment System

The schedule for release of assessment results to districts can be found at <u>Assessment Data</u> <u>Reporting Timeline</u>. DPI will publicly release summary test score data for the assessments in the fall. As such, DPI strongly recommends that districts coordinate their own public release with the DPI public release. After the secure release of results to districts and prior to the public release, DPI performs additional quality assurance, data validation, and data redaction when needed to protect student privacy.

Districts may share their summary assessment results with their school boards prior to the DPI public release. Districts may not publicly share personally identifiable information and therefore would be responsible to ensure shared results are redacted to comply with data security and student privacy requirements, as outlined in the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and state law. More information about maintaining student data privacy is available on the <u>Student Data Privacy webpage</u>.

District summary data may be shared with district and school staff who understand the data security and student privacy requirements outlined in FERPA and state law. This allows district staff to use the data for professional development, continuous improvement efforts, and other planning purposes. Districts may share individual student reports with parents or guardians, teachers, school leaders, and others with a legitimate interest.

Districts should not share the statewide data reported in the vendor portals. This data has not yet been through DPI's quality assurance and validation process and is therefore subject to change. Final statewide results, which are used in accountability calculations, will be released in the fall.

DAC Contact Updates During the Summer and into the 2024-25 School Year

It is important to keep your District Assessment Coordinator (DAC) contact information up to date over the summer months and as staffing changes occur from 2023-24 to 2024-25. Communications from OEA will be sent to DACs over the summer and into early fall regarding assessment and accountability, including information on data and reporting availability. You may need to assign an Interim DAC to ensure your district continues to receive updates while filling the DAC position for the 2024-25 school year. The DAC contact information is used to verify who should have DAC level access to reports in the vendor portals. Be sure to complete a <u>DAC Update</u> form with the appropriate effective date noted if any changes are needed for the coming months.

The 2024-25 annual <u>District Assessment Coordinator (DAC) and Technology Coordinator (DTC)</u> <u>contact update forms</u> may be submitted by all districts beginning July 1. Please make note of the effective date on the update form. These forms are required for both new and returning DACs and DTCs, even if the information has not changed. The information provided is used to:

- Ensure DACs receive regular assessment and accountability updates, and
- Upload information into vendor portals to ensure DACs have annual permissions.

DAC and DTC Update forms must be signed by the District

Administrator/Superintendent. Districts should also remove permissions in the test vendor portals (or make inactive) from any individuals who are no longer employed by the district and adjust user roles to sync with staffing changes.

Reporting

PreACT Secure school and district summary reports, student level data files, and all student scores and Individualized Student Reports (ISRs) will be final in ACT's Online reporting System on May 30. Reporting resources can be found on the <u>Wisconsin PreACT Secure webpage</u> and the <u>DPI ACT</u> <u>Data and Results webpage</u>.

Student ISRs

Schools should download and print Individual Student Reports (ISRs) and distribute them to students and families after May 30. Please reference the <u>May 28 ACT Program Email</u> for instructions on how to download and for additional resources.

Forward Exam

Translated Individual Student Report (ISR) Templates

Districts are responsible for the secure distribution of the ISRs to parents/guardians in a language they can understand and in a format that is accessible to them. Districts and schools may include a copy of the Spanish or Hmong translated ISR with the English ISR so families have a better understanding of their student's results. If translated sample ISRs are needed in languages other than Spanish and Hmong, DACs must contact the <u>DRC Help Desk</u>. Additional ISR translations will be made available as DRC fulfills district requests on the <u>Forward Exam Data and Results</u> webpage. There are currently 11 additional languages already requested by districts which will be available.

Forward Exam Reports

Individual Student Reports (ISRs) and summary reports are expected to be available electronically in the DRC INSIGHT Portal July 26. Hard copy ISRs will be mailed to districts August 27. Districts now have the option to decline the paper ISRs by having their DAC complete and submit the <u>2024</u> <u>Forward Exam Request to Decline Paper Individual Student Reports (ISRs) Form</u> by June 28. Districts are still required to provide parents/guardians with a complete ISR in either a secure electronic version or paper version.
