Verification

Outreach

- Outreach for the School Breakfast Program must happen prior to the beginning of the school year.
- All SFAs operating NSLP are required to inform households before the end of the school year of the availability and location of meals offered through the SFSP. Outreach for SFSP must be completed by all SFAs regardless of whether or not SFSP is offered by the SFA itself. Acceptable outreach activities may include developing and distributing printed and electronic materials that provide information on the availability and location of summer meals to families of school children prior to the end of the school year. SFAs may distribute information through means normally used to communicate with households of enrolled children. For example, a link to the SFSP site map could be included in a spring parent newsletter. Food Safety

- The most recent inspection report must be posted in a publicly visible location.
- Ensure the refrigerators are only for food service use. No personal items allowable.
- Ensure there is proper rotation of the milks to ensure the same milks is not sitting in the fridge for too long.

Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program

• It is allowable for teachers to also consume a single snack each day with the students' snack to model healthy eating behaviors.

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Although extra red/orange vegetables may be used toward the other vegetable subgroup, the other vegetable subgroup category does contain a variety of vegetables with important nutrients. During the week of review, there were no vegetables from the other vegetable subgroup. Instead, extra carrots from the red/orange subgroup were used to cover it. Consider adding vegetables from the other vegetable subgroup to the weekly menu to expose students to different vegetables.

Production Records

Infant and Pre-K Meal Pattern

- Pre-K students are allowed to be served the K-8 meal pattern when they are served at the same time and in the
 same place as the other grade groups, under the co-mingling flexibility. This flexibility may be used in situations in
 which it would be a challenge for staff to determine during meal service if a child is in pre-K or older. It may also
 be used when it would be difficult to provide each age group the proper foods and portion sizes according to the
 grade-appropriate meal patterns.
- The infant and pre-K meal patterns require cereal to contain no more than 6 grams of total sugars per dry ounce.
 This requirement will help reduce children's consumption of added sugars. The Cocoa Puffs are over in sugar. For more information, please refer to the <u>Infants and Preschool in NSLP and SBP webpage</u> (https://dpi.wi.gov/school-nutrition/national-school-lunch-program/infants-and-preschool).
- Offer Versus Serve (OVS) is not an appropriate service style for pre-K students who are not co-mingled. It may
 interfere with the nutrition goals of the pre-K meal pattern, as well as the goal of introducing new foods to
 children while they are still developing food preferences. Instead, pre-K students should be served all the
 required components in at least the minimum amounts at each meal or the SFA may implement family style meal
 service.
