	Finding #2: There were no serving sizes, leftovers, or planned/actual quantity prepared filled out on the salad bar production records. Salad bar production records must meet the same criteria as production records used to record main line items. 	Finding #3: Milk usage is not recorded on the production records. Production records are the SFA's way of proving that reimbursable meals were served; therefore, all items offered as part of the reimbursable meal must be recorded. A milk recipe is currently on file, however total milks served each day is not recorded.
	Corrective Action: Submit one full week (5 days) of completed breakfast, lunch, and

The salad bar is offered as a separate reimbursable serving line, but students did not have access to a vegetable from the legume subgroup during the week of review. The lunch meal pattern requires students to have access to at least ½ cup of beans/peas (legumes) weekly. Future findings related to vegetable subgroup shortages may be subject to fiscal action. Corrective Action: Submit a statement explaining how the weekly legume vegetable subgroup will be met for the salad bar line.

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Technical Assistance Entries:

Comments

Several items on the salad bar were served with tongs during onsite observation. Proper portion size utensils must be used and are very important for self-service foods. This helps to encourage students to take the planned amount, and ensure the amount needed for a reimbursable meal is taken.

Comments

Technical assistance was provided on crediting. The following items were credited incorrectly on the production record:

Taco meat: USDA product information sheet indicates that 1.72 oz (by weight) contributes 1 oz eq m/ma toward the meal pattern. -Production record credited 2.67 oz (by weight) as 2.25 oz eq m/ma, but 2.67 ounces by weight only contributes 1.5 oz eq m/ma toward the meal pattern.

Tortilla: Production record indicates the tortilla on taco day credits as 2 oz eq grain, but the product formulation statement provided for the 12" tortilla contributes 3.5 oz eq grains toward the meal pattern.

Ham: The product formulation statement provided for sliced ham indicates that 2 oz (by weight) contributes 0.75 oz eq m/ma toward the meal pattern. The production record indicates the menu planner crediting a 3 oz (by weight) serving as 2.5 oz eq m/ma, but it only contributes 1 oz eq m/ma.

Chips: The production record credited chips as 1 oz eq grain, but these products are not accompanied by a product formulation statement (PFS), and therefore cannot contribute toward the meal pattern. The exception to this is the Baked Cheetos, which were accompanied by a PFS.

The production record credited the salad mixture as $\frac{1}{2}$ cup of dark green vegetables. Since the lettuce mixture is only $\frac{1}{4}$ spinach, a 1 cup serving of the lettuce mix would contribute $\frac{1}{8}$ cup of dark green vegetables and $\frac{3}{8}$ cup other vegetables toward the meal pattern.

Comments

Be specific on production records about the identity, brand, portion size, and description of items served. Instead of "juice" or "chips," list the specific types of juice or chips separately to clearly indicate what was served.
