## Agency Updates (30 minutes)

- Department of Public Instruction (DPI) F2S Team 5 minutes
  - Contact: <u>DPIF2S@dpi.wi.gov</u>
  - The DPI School Nutrition Team has hired three, full time F2S staff Brittany Zerbe, Jeff Mallegni, and David Lee Schneider. These are considered project positions with funding secured until September 2026. These positions serve to help schools incorporate F2S activities including local foods into school breakfast and lunch programs, increase nutrition and agricultural education, and grow school gardens.
  - Plans for the next 3 years include:
    - Training: Produce Processing demos, school garden workshops, appear throughout the state at conferences. Feel free to request us to speak!
    - New resources: In a Nutshell for Producers with licensing requirements, <u>Crediting for School Nutrition Programs: A Resource for Producers</u> (information on school meal requirements and the documentation schools require for local purchasing), sample <u>F2S Staff Position Descriptions</u>. Coming soon: template SOPs for receiving school garden produce and buying local, Hmong Toolkit, funding for F2S, sustainability for F2S, procurement, transitioning from the Local Food for Schools (LFS) program.

  - Working on a Specialty Crop Block Grant (Grains to Trays), a project that works on network building and resource development to increase grains and beans in the institutional environment. Will identify three specialty crops for WI Chili Lunch.
  - <u>FoodWlse</u>- SNAP-ed funded; FoodWlse educators work in schools throughout the state. Schools that qualify for FoodWlse educators are schools that have at least 50% of students that qualify for free or reduced-price meals. FoodWlse educators help students access healthy foods.
  - <u>Harvest of the Month (HOM</u>)- statewide campaign that encourages kids and families to eat more fruits and vegetables. Each month schools showcase one seasonal, Wisconsin-grown fruit or vegetable. Students taste, explore and learn about the importance of eating fruits and vegetables.
  - Working on a statewide outcome evaluation of HOM. An evaluation survey will be sent soon to those who have registered to access HOM materials in the past.

  - HOM for the ECE setting coming soon! Waiting on the Spanish translation. Slated to become available in Fall 2024.
  - Hmong HOM coming soon! Hoping to have materials ready for 2025.
  - Harvest of the Moon 2.0 (second year)- available soon. <u>Harvest of the Month 1.0</u> is currently available.
  - New staff member: Marisa Dyer. Marisa is working with counties in northern Wisconsin to develop an Ojibwe version of Harvest of the Moon.
- Kids Forward/healthTIDE: USDA School Food Transformation Grant- 5 minutes
  - <u>USDA School Food Transformation Innovation grants</u> due April 30. Hoping for many Wisconsin awards!

- Round two of Spark awards available in 2025, round two of Innovation awards in 2026.
- Michigan, Illinois, and Indiana and Wisconsin all collaborating with the Lake Michigan school Food System Innovation Hub.
- This is a well-supported grant, intentional about the equity aspect. These grants focus on infrastructure- connecting kids to healthy food provided by local farmers.
- Wisconsin Youth Conversations: healthTIDE and Kids Forward hosted four conversations with 30 thoughtful middle and high school Latino, Black, and Asian students from Milwaukee, Appleton, and Stevens Point during December 2023 and January 2024. The goal was to get their honest perspectives on healthy foods at home, in school, and in their neighborhoods. Summary and full report available at the link above.
