 - The 50/50 nature provides us a reasonable starting point

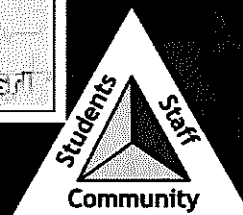
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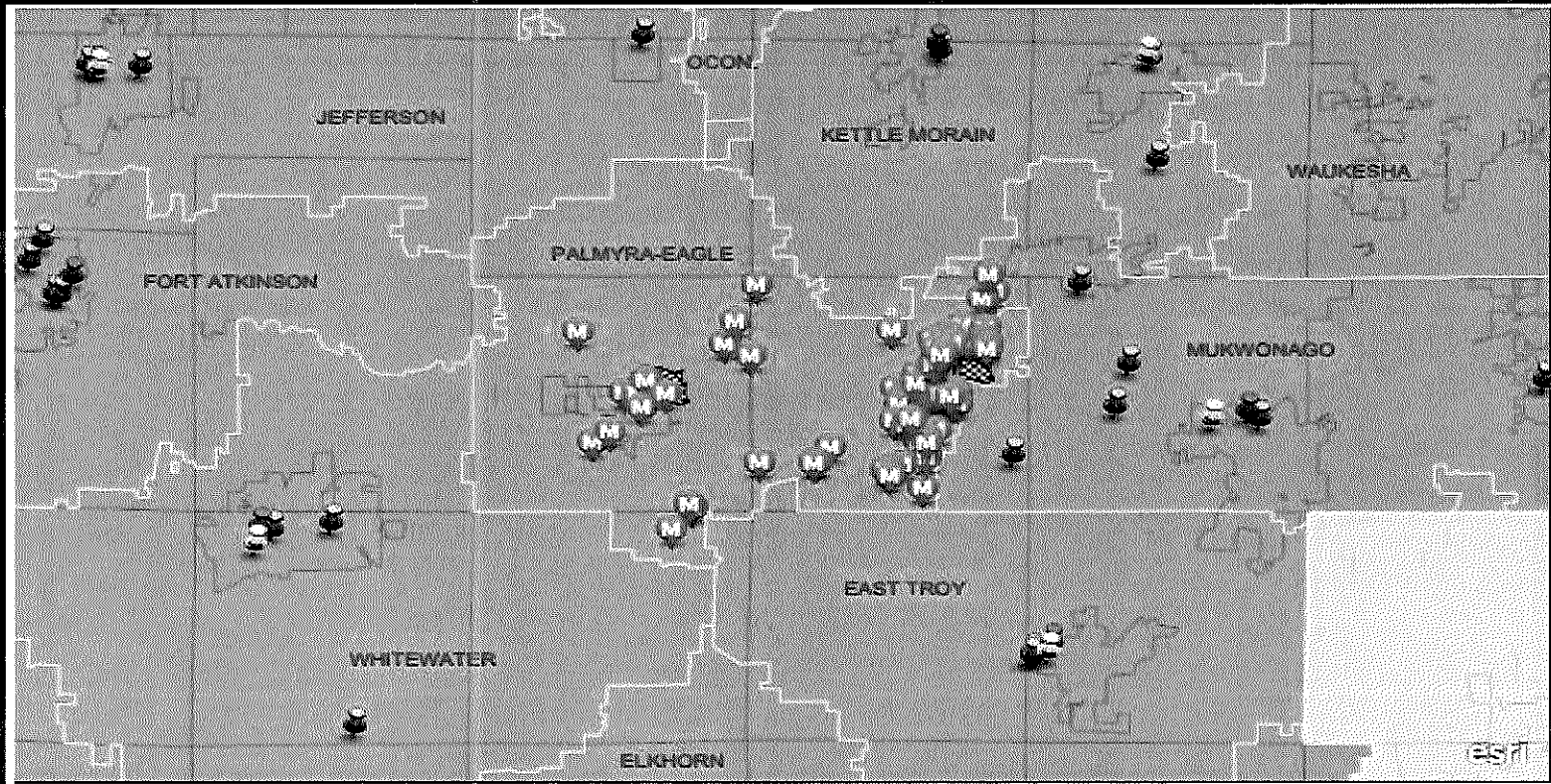

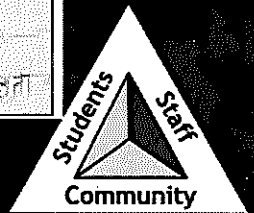
