Cedarburg School Board Meeting February 20, 2019

Jennifer Wirth - I'm Jennifer Wirth. I live at 12517 N. Emily Lane in Mequon. First, thank you for the opportunity to come speak to you. I really appreciate it. To give you a little bit of background on why I am here ... obviously to petition for the boundaries to be moved. My husband and I jointly own this 40-acre property with my brother-in-law which is the northern border of the Mequon-Thiensville School District. Both families currently do live elsewhere in the district and have 6 kids enrolled there in total. No students at this point would be removed from Cedarburg School District and as you said there are 3 addresses that are stated on your agenda; those are going to be resurveyed down to 2 addresses and as again there are going to be two single family homes built on this property. Just to note that as well. We have owned this land since 2010 and had access to it prior to taking over ownership. This land would not be further subdivided other than those two properties or two addresses, just take note of that also. I understand these petitions are unlikely to be approved, but I feel it is time for both school districts to start to consider moving these boundaries into the Mequon properties with the Mequon-Thiensville School District. Some other things to consider is the travel time, educational needs of our students are obviously already being met in Mequon Thiensville which is obviously where we would like to stay. I'm not sure I understand the detachment affects in terms of the tax dollars and things like that, obviously that would be removing from the Cedarburg School District, but obviously from our prospective we would like to keep those tax dollars in Mequon-Thiensville. But we wouldn't be affecting your enrollment because we aren't currently enrolled here and would likely do Open Enrollment process through Mequon-Thiensville. So all of our students are bright students and as families we contribute we are already there, we contribute to Mequon-Thiensville School District, the Educational Foundation, activities, PTO, sports and things like that, so we would like to have our children stay where they have already started their education. Although I can tell that Cedarburg is a great place to be as I've seen through your all of your recognitions and celebrations tonight, we just want to stay where we're at. Again, I really appreciate the time and feedback and information and learning how this process works, but again we hope that school district starts to consider taking a look at the boundaries on the southern side of your school district.

Kevin Kennedy – I have a question, if I can ask. Two of them. When you purchased the land in 2010, were you aware it was in the Cedarburg School District?

Jennifer Wirth – Probably. I think we had the intentions if I can think back that far, and it was almost prechildren even. But you know like I said we had access to the land prior to that and it was really hunting land for my husband and my brother—in-law, and I feel like our thought process at the time was you know we would build on it eventually maybe in our retirement years or something like that. But now the time has come where we are out growing our home in Mequon and we're kind of ready to build on it a little bit sooner than maybe we originally thought, so life changes.

Kevin Kennedy – I have one more follow up question. In the past, I don't know when it was, a number of years ago, we had another neighboring district want to move into our district and one of the arguments they made, which I personally thought was compelling, was the distance to the school district they were in was much further to each of the elementary schools, middle schools and high school was a much further drive. In this case I think some research was done and each of our elementary, middle school and high schools are not quite half but about half the distance to the Mequon Schools which to me was a compelling argument from those other people were making which never went through, nothing happened. But I thought that was a compelling issue to look at when looking at schools like we do have on our other border with Grafton we've got a school Thorson school on the border and it serves people of Grafton because they can walk to school. You wouldn't be able to walk from your location, but that was a compelling discussion at

that point of time. You are aware, because your kids go to Mequon schools now, you are aware distances are further if you were in Mequon.

Jennifer Wirth – Yes, yes, although it's really not that far it's something obviously we wouldn't have the opportunity, I don't think, for transportation you know, but I think I clocked it one day and it's maybe 6 miles or something like that to the nearest elementary and middle school.

Brandon Goldbeck – Have you investigated the Open Enrollment likelihood if you were going to live there if you are currently in our district. Would they still take you?

Jennifer Wirth – I believe so, yeah. Maybe a formality, but it's worth a try.

Jeff Brey – Any more questions, comments? Thank you very much for standing up there and your patience for waiting for this.

Jennifer Wirth – *Thank you very much*.

Todd Bugnacki – So Board members, there is a motion in front of you to either accept or deny the request to change the school district boundaries.

Jeff Brey – I'll move to deny.

Kevin Kennedy – I'll second that.

Jeff Brey – Any discussion on this?

Kevin Kennedy – I would like to also make note to, this has been the boundaries for many many decades, I don't even know how long, but many many years. I think the options are still available to you if you choose to go to Mequon school district to where they go already. I think our schools are actually closer but like we talked before, but I think there are compelling reasons not to start to make a change.

Brandon Goldbeck - I'd really love to have you go to our schools. They're really good.

Jennifer Wirth – I can see that as well.

David Krier – The other thing is that it's not just about the current residents either. It's in the future and kind of a precedent. It may be challenging for the next owner to have to be in the Mequon district to Kevin's point if the distance to other schools is close.

Jeff Brey – I think Kevin's point is on that these boundaries have been there a long time and districts have respected each other's boundaries over the years. I'll take a motion . . . all those in favor say aye.



We have received a resident petition to alter our school district boundaries to join Mequon School District. The request includes three site addresses and are from an area on N Granville RD, south of Pioneer RD, on the east side of the road. Currently, there are no houses on the petitioned properties; however, there are a number of houses in the area that have or have had active CSD students. The map is attached for your reference.

Per state statute, the petitioners had to file the paperwork to our district by Feb. 1, 2019, and our School Board must take action by March 1, 2019. State Statue indicates that we must allow the petitioners to address the Board during the February Board meeting. The topic will be noted on the agenda as an action item so that discussion can ensue and the Board can take a formal vote. The Administration recommends that the Board deny the Petition to Alter School District boundaries on 14150, 14230, and 14280 N Granville RD, Mequon.

I have contacted the Superintendent of Mequon to notice him on the request to change boundaries. A copy of the petition was also shared. At this point, he has not indicated how his Board will respond to the petition. If we vote no and the Mequon Board votes no or yes, the petitioners have the option of appealing to the Department of Public Instruction, in which case a hearing will be set for all sides to present their case. <u>Historically, when the resident district has voted NO to change a boundary, the DPI has never overturned the district's decision</u>.

Subject: Small Territory Detachment; Right to Appeal File 19-03

The petition, **file 19-03**, to detach property from the Cedarburg School District and attach it to the Mequon-Thiensville School District, has been denied. Petitioners whose property detachment requests have been denied have a right to appeal under the provisions of section 117.12(4), Wisconsin statutes.

The law provides that a majority of the electors residing in the territory, or the owners of 50% or more of the territory, may appeal the denial to an appeal panel by filing notice of appeal with the secretary of the School District Boundary Appeal Board **before** the March 15 following the denial. See s.115.01 (13), Wisconsin statutes, for a definition of electors.

The law further provides that the State Superintendent may charge a filing fee for such appeals. The appeal filing fee is \$750.00 – see <u>https://dpi.wi.gov/sms/school-district-boundary-appeal-board</u> for the fee schedule.

Enclosed is a form that may be used to file a notice of appeal. The request should be sent to the address noted and must be accompanied by the required filing fee. The request and required filing fee must be received at the DPI, 125 S. Webster Street in Madison, <u>by 4:30 p.m. on</u> <u>Thursday, March 14</u>. You may wish to consider Priority Mail or in-person delivery to ensure timely arrival. Materials received after March 14 will be returned as not timely.

We will do our best to schedule the hearing for a day a district representative is available, but cannot guarantee that will occur. When the hearing schedule is finalized the district will be notified, in writing, of the date, time and location. If no district representative is available to attend on that day, written information may be submitted.

PI 2.04, Wisconsin Administrative Code, directs that the **clerk of the school board of an affected school district** shall submit the following materials to the Secretary of the School District Boundary Appeal Board at the Department of Public Instruction (DPI):

- 1. A certified copy of any resolution related to any reorganization proceeding under Chapter 117, Wis. Stats. (If a resolution has already been sent to the DPI, it is not necessary to send another copy.)
- 2. Any reorganization order filed as required under sec. 117.17, Wis. Stats. (If there is no reorganization order or a reorganization order has already been sent to the DPI, it is not necessary to provide a copy.)
- 3. A copy of the notice of any school board hearing on a petition or a resolution for reorganization; transcribed minutes, transcribed stenographic record, or transcribed electronic recording of hearing; and, a correct copy of all exhibits and data submitted at the hearing. If the hearing was a joint hearing, the clerk of the school board from which said territory is proposed to be detached shall submit the information.
- 4. Any written statement of facts and other relevant matters relating to a proposed reorganization.

Both districts are also asked to provide the following two items:

- 5. A class schedule showing the course offerings available in the school or schools that the children of the petitioners attend or would attend. Generally this is a two to three page summary see the enclosed example.
- 6. School district map clearly indicating the location of properties under appeal.

These materials and summary information prepared by the department from district data already on file will be sent in advance of the hearing to the SDBAB panel members, the petitioners, and other district representatives.

The required materials are needed no later than two weeks before the scheduled hearing. Though we have not yet finalized hearing dates, your district may wish to assemble the materials described above and submit them as soon as is convenient. 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SUBCHAPTER II STATE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION

115.28 General duties. The state superintendent shall:

(1) GENERAL SUPERVISION. Ascertain the condition of the public schools, stimulate interest in education and spread as widely as possible a knowledge of the means and methods which may be employed to improve the schools.

(2) SECTARIANISM. Exclude all sectarian books and instruction from the public schools.

(3) SUPERVISION OF SCHOOLS. Supervise and inspect the public schools and day schools for children with disabilities, advise the principals and local authorities thereof and give assistance in organizing such schools.

(3m) SUPERVISION OF COOPERATIVE EDUCATIONAL SERVICE AGENCIES; RULES. (a) Supervise and audit the receipts and expenditures of the cooperative educational service agencies, conduct program review of the agencies, supervise boundary reorganization where necessary, advise the administrators of the agencies and provide assistance in organizing the agencies throughout the state.

(b) Promulgate rules establishing procedures for the reorganization of cooperative educational service agencies and boundary appeals.

(4) PUBLIC INFORMATION. By reports, bulletins, circulars, correspondence and public addresses, give the public information upon the different methods of school organization and management and the subject of education generally.

(5) APPEALS. Examine and determine all appeals which by law are made to the state superintendent and prescribe rules of practice in respect thereto, not inconsistent with law.

(6) ANNUAL CONVENTIONS. Annually, hold conventions of school district administrators, supervisors and agency coordinators.

3-27-07

117.15 Criteria for school district reorganizations. In making any decision under ss. 117.08 to 117.132, a school board, the board and an appeal panel shall consider the following factors as they affect the educational welfare of all of the children residing in all of the affected school districts, and may consider other appropriate factors:

(1) The geographical and topographical characteristics of the affected school districts, including the estimated travel time to and from school for pupils in the school districts.

(2) The educational needs of all of the children residing in the affected school districts, the educational programs currently offered by each affected school district and the ability and commitment of each school district to meet those needs and continue to offer those educational programs.

(2m) If territory is proposed to be detached from one school district and attached to an adjoining school district or proposed to be included in a new school district under s. 117.105, whether the proposed detachment will have any adverse effect on the program currently offered by the school district from which the territory is proposed to be detached, including both curricular and extracurricular aspects of that program.

(3) The testimony of and written statements filed by the residents of the affected school districts.

(4) The estimated fiscal effect of the proposed reorganization on the affected school districts, including the effect of the apportionment of assets and liabilities.

(5) Whether the proposed reorganization will make any part of a school district's territory noncontiguous.

(6) The socioeconomic level and racial composition of the pupils who reside or will reside in territory proposed to be detached from one school district and attached to an adjoining school district, in territory proposed to be included in a new school district under s. 117.105 or in school districts proposed to be consolidated or in a school district proposed to be dissolved; the proportion of the pupils who reside in such territory who are children at risk, as defined under s. 118.153(1)(a); and the effect that the pupils described in this paragraph will have on the present and future socioeconomic level and racial composition of the affected school districts and on the proportion of the affected school districts' enrollments that will be children at risk.

(7) The results of any referendum held under s. 117.10.
