Transcribed Minutes of Public Hearing on Petition to Alter School Boundaries Held February 18, 2019

Public Hearing on Petition to Alter School Boundaries - 7:00 p.m. in the District Office Board Room - McFarland High School 5101 Farwell Street McFarland, WI 53558

Administrators Present:

Andrew Briddell, Jeff Mahoney, Melissa Pfohl, Lauren Arango, Jeff Finstad, Anne Nichols, David Piovanetti, Aaron Tarnutzer, and Brooke Hauser.

"As Chair of this public hearing on reorganization, I hereby call this hearing to order."

"I am Arlyn Halvorson, School Board President. Let the record indicate that the board resolution which set forth the date and time of this hearing also contained my appointment as Chair. The original copy of that resolution is here, should you wish to view it."

"It has been suggested that Ann Molitor be the secretary for this hearing. I will entertain a motion to this effect. Motion by Howery, second by Allen to appoint Ann Molitor as secretary for the public hearing. Motion carried 5-0.

Ann Molitor read the notice of the meeting

School Board Members Present: Arlyn Halvorson, Craig Howery, Ann Molitor, Tom Mooney, and Tom Allen.

School Board Members Absent: None.

District Legal Counsel: Chad Wade

Arlyn Halvorson, Chair read:

"The school board(s) shall consider and weigh the following factors as they affect the educational welfare of all the children of all the school districts affected by the proposed reorganization:

The geographical and topographical characteristics of the affected school districts, including the estimated travel time to and from school for pupils in the school districts;

The educational needs of all children residing in the affected school districts, the educational programs currently offered by each affected school district and the ability and commitment of each school district to meet those needs and continue to offer those educational programs;

If territory is proposed to be detached from one school district and attached to an adjoining school district, whether the proposed detachment will have any adverse effect on the program currently offered by the school district from which the territory is proposed to be detached, including both curricular and extracurricular aspects of that program;

The testimony of and written statements filed by the residents of the affected school districts;

The estimated fiscal effect of the proposed reorganization of the affected school districts, including the effect of the apportionment of assets and liabilities;

Whether the proposed reorganization will make any part of a school district's territory noncontiguous;

The socioeconomic level and racial composition of the pupils who reside or will reside in territory proposed to be detached from one school district and attached to an adjoining school district or in a school district proposed to be dissolved; the proportion of the pupils who reside in such territory who are children at risk, as defined under s. 118.153(91)(a); and the effect that the pupils described in this paragraph will have on the present and future socioeconomic level and racial composition of the affected school districts and the proportion of the affected school districts' enrollments that will be children at risk.

In reaching its decision, the school board(s) may consider and weigh other appropriate factors as needed."

"At this time I will present an overview of the petition to provide a common background of developments and issues for the school board(s) and those present at this meeting."

"Before taking testimony, I would like to review the rules applicable to this hearing. This is an informal hearing, but we will record all of the information presented. Each person offering information will come to the table where you may either sit or stand. Please state your name, address, and school district. Speak distinctly so that we can be sure that your information is recorded. The procedure is to hear from the proponents and opponents of the petition. The proponents, those people asking the school board(s) to transfer the territory, will be heard first. Following the proponents, the opponents of the petition, those people who do not want the territory transferred, will be heard. Following the initial presentation by the proponents and opponents, there will be a short time allotted for rebuttal and/or summation by both sides in the same order as before."

"May I have the proponents of the petition please come forward"

Andrew Hoyos spoke as a proponent of the petition.

"My name is Andrew Hoyos, I live at 5972 Oak Hollow Dr. McFarland, WI 53558. We did submit a petition to change the boundaries of a parcel of land. The parcel is right on the McFarland School District line. We currently have two daughters that attend the McFarland School District and we want them to continue to stay in the McFarland School District. We plan to build a house on that property within the next two to three years."

Halvorson: "Where is that property located?"

Hoyos: "It's on Mahoney Road in the Town of Dunn."

Halvorson: "Whereabouts on Mahoney Road? I live on Mahoney Road."

Hoyos: "Oh, sure. It's a little bit north of B."

Halvorson: "On the west side of Mahoney Road?"

Hoyos: "On the east side of Mahoney Road."

Halvorson: "On the east side of Mahoney Road, but you're just north of B?"

Hoyos: "Yes, so there's the horse farm there on the corner and."

Halvorson: "Yeah, now I know where you're at. Thank you. That's just for my general knowledge. You're in my back door and I'd kind of like to know where you're at."

Halvorson: "Any questions or comments or is there anything more you'd like to add?"

Hoyos: "No, I'd just really like my family to remain in the McFarland School District. We've been very happy in the McFarland School District."

Halvorson: "Thank you,"

Halvorson: "Are there any other proponents to the petition?" "There are none."

Halvorson: "So let's move on the opponents of the petition. Are there any opponents to the petition?" "There are none."

PROPONENTS' OPPORTUNITY FOR ADDITIONAL INFORMATION - None.

OPPONENTS' OPPORTUNITY FOR ADDITIONAL INFORMATION - None.

Halvorson: "At this time I will close the public presentations on this petition and open the school board(s) deliberations. The only information presented hereafter will be on request of the school board members concerning the information received by them or brought out in this meeting. Are there any questions or information that any board member would like answered or clarified? Each board member that would like to state their thoughts on this petition may do so now."

Molitor: "I have one question to clarify. Even if we would grant the transfer of territory, the Oregon School District would also have to grant the transfer."

Wade: "Correct. Both Boards hold meetings. Sometimes they are joint, and sometimes they are held separately. Both districts would have to approve of the petition for it to be effective."

Molitor: "Okay."

Halvorson: "Any other questions?"

Mooney: "You're living in the McFarland School District now and you're building a home in the Oregon School District? Does that create an island?"

Hoyos: "No, it does not."

Halvorson: "Any other question?"

Motion by Howery, second by Mooney to grant the transfer of the territory described in the petition. That the reorganization requested in the petition filed on January 29, 2019, be granted and an order entered detaching the territory described in said petition from the Oregon School District and attaching said territory to the School District of McFarland.

Mooney: "What kind of timeline are we looking at for Oregon to address this?"

Wade: "Their hearing would have to happen in February. They may have already held their hearing. If approved by both boards, the reorganization would be effective on July 1, 2019."

Vote by ballot. Ann Molitor tabulated the results of the ballots. Allen-Yes; Mooney-Yes; Howery-Yes; Halvorson-Yes; Molitor-Yes. Motion carried 5-0.

Motion by Mooney, second by Howery to adopt a resolution authorizing issuance of an order of reorganization. Motion carried 5-0.

Public hearing adjourned at 7:13 p.m.

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




The law provides that a majority of the electors residing in the territory, or the owners of 50% or more of the territory, may appeal the denial to an appeal panel by filing notice of appeal with the secretary of the School District Boundary Appeal Board <u>before</u> the March 15 following the denial. See s.115.01 (13), Wisconsin statutes, for a definition of electors.

The law further provides that the State Superintendent may charge a filing fee for such appeals. The appeal filing fee is \$750.00 – see https://dpi.wi.gov/sms/school-district-boundary-appeal-board for the fee schedule.

SUBCHAPTER II STATE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION

115.28 General duties. The state superintendent shall:

- (1) GENERAL SUPERVISION. Ascertain the condition of the public schools, stimulate interest in education and spread as widely as possible a knowledge of the means and methods which may be employed to improve the schools.
- (2) SECTARIANISM. Exclude all sectarian books and instruction from the public schools.
- (3) SUPERVISION OF SCHOOLS. Supervise and inspect the public schools and day schools for children with disabilities, advise the principals and local authorities thereof and give assistance in organizing such schools.
- (3m) SUPERVISION OF COOPERATIVE EDUCATIONAL SERVICE AGENCIES; RULES. (a) Supervise and audit the receipts and expenditures of the cooperative educational service agencies, conduct program review of the agencies, supervise boundary reorganization where necessary, advise the administrators of the agencies and provide assistance in organizing the agencies throughout the state.
- (b) Promulgate rules establishing procedures for the reorganization of cooperative educational service agencies and boundary appeals.
- (4) PUBLIC INFORMATION. By reports, bulletins, circulars, correspondence and public addresses, give the public information upon the different methods of school organization and management and the subject of education generally.
- (5) APPEALS. Examine and determine all appeals which by law are made to the state superintendent and prescribe rules of practice in respect thereto, not inconsistent with law.
- (6) ANNUAL CONVENTIONS. Annually, hold conventions of school district administrators, supervisors and agency coordinators.

- 117.15 Criteria for school district reorganizations. In making any decision under ss. 117.08 to 117.132, a school board, the board and an appeal panel shall consider the following factors as they affect the educational welfare of all of the children residing in all of the affected school districts, and may consider other appropriate factors:
- (1) The geographical and topographical characteristics of the affected school districts, including the estimated travel time to and from school for pupils in the school districts.
- (2) The educational needs of all of the children residing in the affected school districts, the educational programs currently offered by each affected school district and the ability and commitment of each school district to meet those needs and continue to offer those educational programs.
- (2m) If territory is proposed to be detached from one school district and attached to an adjoining school district or proposed to be included in a new school district under s. 117.105, whether the proposed detachment will have any adverse effect on the program currently offered by the school district from which the territory is proposed to be detached, including both curricular and extracurricular aspects of that program.
- (3) The testimony of and written statements filed by the residents of the affected school districts.
- (4) The estimated fiscal effect of the proposed reorganization on the affected school districts, including the effect of the apportionment of assets and liabilities.
- (5) Whether the proposed reorganization will make any part of a school district's territory noncontiguous.
- (6) The socioeconomic level and racial composition of the pupils who reside or will reside in territory proposed to be detached from one school district and attached to an adjoining school district, in territory proposed to be included in a new school district under s. 117.105 or in school districts proposed to be consolidated or in a school district proposed to be dissolved; the proportion of the pupils who reside in such territory who are children at risk, as defined under s. 118.153(1)(a); and the effect that the pupils described in this paragraph will have on the present and future socioeconomic level and racial composition of the affected school districts and on the proportion of the affected school districts' enrollments that will be children at risk.
 - (7) The results of any referendum held under s. 117.10.
