

Opioid Antagonist/Naloxone Training Programs Approved for Use (5/15/2024)

Note that a skills check (demonstration) is required for all school staff administering a medication to a student, this also applies to an opioid antagonist. School staff are also given authorization via statute to administer an opioid antagonist to any person who appears to be experiencing an opioid overdose (not just students).
