Stanford Taylor to tour Milwaukee schools, see how students utilize Career and Technical Education programs

State superintendent will visit Bay View High School and James Madison Academic Campus

MADISON – State Superintendent Carolyn Stanford Taylor will learn how students benefit from various Career and Technical Education programs offered by visiting and touring two Milwaukee schools on Thursday.
